On May 28, 2020, God sent for His Angel, Marilyn Burnett, to leave her earthly home and to say farewell as she entered her heavenly home. She was a virtuous woman with great faith and loved the Lord. She shared her love with her family, her friends and all she encountered. Marilyn was a giver! She genuinely cared for others, enjoyed having fun, dancing and celebrating, and she was an extraordinary cook! Marilyn had Godgiven strength and courage, as she would not hesitate to call things the way she saw it, yet in love; and was steadfast in faith through the challenges of life. She was a “special gift from God” who blessed the lives of many, for she was a “Gift” that never stopped giving.

Marilyn Kemp (Harden) Coast Burnett was born October 4, 1943 to the late Richard and Bertha Kemp Harden in Savannah, GA. Marilyn grew up in West Savannah on Scarborough Street. She was raised with her nine brothers and was the only girl.

Marilyn received her education and training while in Savannah. She graduated from Sophronia M. Thompkins High School in Savannah, Georgia. After dating in high school, Marilyn married Joe Coast Sr.

and moved to Rochester, New York. From this union, they were blessed with four children: Antoinette, Joseph, Jeffrey and Jerome. Upon returning to Savannah, GA, she continued her education and training at Savannah Vocational Technical College. Marilyn began her career working at Candler Hospital as a Central Service Technician. She retired from Emory University Hospital, as a Central Service Technician.

During her time in Savannah, she worshiped and attended the United House of Prayer for All People. She loved to work with the young children. Every year, she enjoyed working

with the children for the Easter program. She ensured the facility was beautifully decorated with pastel colors as the children were excited to parade their new outfits going up to recite their Easter speeches. This joy continued over the years as she moved on in her life, giving Easter baskets/gifts to her children, grandchildren, and the many children she embraced as her own.

After many years passed, Marilyn met her prince charming, William Burnett, while still in Savannah. He captured her heart and brought a new joy to her life. William and Marilyn married on June 7, 1980. They later moved to Metro Atlanta and settled in Decatur.

Marilyn joined New Birth Missionary Baptist Church in December 1989. She loved her church and her pastors: the late Bishop Eddie L Long, Bishop Stephen Davis and Dr. Jamal Harrison Bryant. Over the years, she served her church in many capacities: Bessie Grady Usher Board, Nurses Guild, she was one of the first who cooked and served meals before Bible Study, Repasts and other various events. She served alongside her husband in the Deacons Ministry as a Deacon's Wife. She and Deacon Burnett took the lead role in serving the Mother's Board. Marilyn continued serving faithfully in the Deacons Ministry, even after her husband's passing. She had a gift to connect with people in a way that made them feel very special, and it was genuine. Marilyn's ministry extended to others inside and outside the church, as she was an encourager, sending cards, flowers or making phone calls to check on others. Her delicious meals would always lift your spirit, as well. The Deacons Ministry and New Birth, was not just the ministry where she served, but her extended family. Marilyn was very special to, and loved, by her New Birth Family.

You can't mention Marilyn without mentioning her passion for cooking. She became known as "Marilyn the Cook." She never met a stranger and would feed everyone that came into her presence whether you wanted to eat or not, she was not taking "no" for an answer. Her love for cooking began in Savannah and little did she know that it would one day become a business for her. She had what you called back in the day "Rent Parties" where she sold dinners, etc. This later evolved into a business where she received contracts to cater and decorate events for hundreds of people.

Time with family and friends were very important and special to Marilyn. Every holiday her house was decorated with the theme of that season. She prepared Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners every year for her family. Her children and grandchildren also looked forward to her preparing their special Birthday Dinners. Family Reunions was an all-time

favorite of hers. She would cook, decorate and buy special gifts for everyone. Over time, her daughter, Antoinette convinced her to pass the baton for planning the family reunions to her.

The 2020 Family Reunion Cruise was cancelled this year due to the Corona Virus. Marilyn had asked her daughter, “what was the plan?” She suggested having it in Atlanta. With all the last-minute changes, Marilyn encouraged her daughter not to stress and offered her backyard as the venue for the reunion. As Marilyn would have it, the family reunion will be in her backyard today.

From Marilyn’s daughter, Antoinette’s heart she shares:

“She was a special lady. She was more than special; she was my mother.”
