Thomas D. Walker, Sr.

Thomas D. Walker founded T.D. WALKER Enterprises, Inc. in January 1998 after serving two years as Manager of Glenwood Lanes bowling center in Decatur. He joined Glenwood as league coordinator in October 1996 shortly after retiring from Chevron Corporation. During his 23 years of service with Chevron, Mr. Walker held positions in California as the Company's Public Affairs representative to Pacific Pipeline System, Inc., Manager of Constituent Relations on the Federal Relations and Communications & Programs staffs in San Francisco; and, Public Affairs Manager in Los Angeles.

Mr. Walker began his career with Chevron as News Representative on the Gulf Corporation staff in June 1973. He was named Supervisor - Technical Information in February 1974 and in September, Public Affairs Representative for Texas, Louisiana and Oklahoma based in Houston. He returned to Pittsburgh in September 1975 as Manager-Public Communications and, in 1979 relocated to Atlanta, GA as Regional Public Affairs Representative and Area Director.

A native of Brownsville, PA, Mr. Walker held a variety of public information positions with the U.S. Army, including five and one-half years as Chief - Internal Communications and Editor of a monthly news magazine for the John F. Kennedy Center for Military Assistance at Fort Bragg, NC. He completed public affairs and management courses conducted by the Defense Information School, New York University, the American Management Association, the University of Chicago, the Gulf Management Institute, DeKalb County (GA) Community College and the Chevron Leadership Development Program Mr. Walker has served as a guest lecturer at the Defense Information School in Indianapolis, IN; San Jose (CA) State University; the Graduate School of Business at the University of Pittsburgh; and the Schools of Business and Journalism at Florida A&M University.

From 1981 to 1992, Mr. Walker chaired the National Conference of Black Mayors Energy & Environment Committee. In addition, he served on the National Black Caucus of State Legislators Corporate Roundtable; as a facilitator and moderator of the Energy Braintrust for the Congressional Black Caucus Legislative Weekend; on the Executive Committee of the Florida A&M University/Industry Cluster, as a member of the National Technical Advisory Committee for Opportunities Industrialization Centers of America, Inc.; as President and Southeast Regional Coordinator of the Atlanta Chapter of the American Association of Blacks in Energy; and, as Vice Chairman of the Board for the APEX, a Black history museum in Atlanta, GA; and as Director of the Voter Education Project and Executive Director of the NAACP in Hoke County, NC.

Among his awards are: six Copy Desks Awards for Journalism Excellence; three Continental Army Command Awards, "The 1982 Black Achievers in Industry" Award from the Harlem Branch of the YMCA; the Triple Service and Meritorious Achievement Awards from Florida A&M University, the Key to the City of Eatonville, FL; the President's Awards of the National Black Caucus of State Legislators and the National Conference of Black Mayors; and the Roy E. Kohler Award from the Opportunities Industrialization Centers of America, Inc.

Mr. Walker was ordained as Baptist minister in July 1966 by the Mt. Sinai Baptist Church in Fayetteville, NC and subsequently pastored the Piney Grove Missionary Baptist Church in Raeford, NC for 5 years. Mr. Walker also served as Assistant Pastor of Community Baptist Church in Bay Point, CA and is currently an associate minister of the Greenforest Community Baptist Church in Decatur, GA

Mr. Walker is married to the former Ms. Beverly K. Upshaw of Chattanooga, TN. They have four children: Michael (deceased), Cheryl, Thomas Jr. and Tyrone (deceased); and ten grandchildren: Greg, Jamieson, Jonathon, Jazmyn, Alexandria, Justin and Michael, Ashley, Yohannes and Olivia.
