



## Alfred Douglas Lee

Alfred Douglas, 68 years old, of Roswell, Georgia, passed away on Friday, April 1, 2016 in the excellent care of Halcyon Hospice Care, located at 5411 Northland Drive, Atlanta, GA.

Born in Atlanta, GA, he was the son of the late Fred D. and Mary (Terrell) Lee. He received his primary education in the Atlanta Public School System. After graduating from Henry McNeal Turner High School, Class of 1965, he furthered his studies at Clark Atlanta University. Thereafter, he enlisted in the United States Army. He began his service in Fort Gordon, GA as a non-commissioned officer, serving as a military policeman in the 1960's and 1970's. After proudly serving his country, he ended his active duty in Fort Riley, Kansas with an honorable discharge, earning the prestigious National Defense Service Medal. Following his service in the U. S. Army, Alfred began a career in government and commercial security loss prevention. During his distinguished career, he worked as a Deputy United States Marshal, protecting U. S. Federal Judges, attorneys, and jurors while safeguarding the United States District Court, U. S. Courthouse, Northern District of Georgia, Atlanta division. He finished his career as a Security Guard with Cox Enterprises, Inc., Corporate Security. He began his employment with "Cox" as a contractor for Allied Barton for seven years, while simultaneously working for Manheim Drive, a division of Cox Enterprises, Inc. Eventually, he was elevated to Corporate Security Ambassador for Cox Enterprises, Inc. Assigned to the Central Park Campus, he was charged with the responsibility

of monitoring pedestrian traffic, viewing and authenticating employee ID badges, and assisting employees with screening and entrance onto the property.
