Please accept my sincere condolences for the passing of your mom, mother-in-law, granny, sister, and aunt. Your loss is monumental and inexpressible, but I hope these recollections of Angela from a friend will give you a measure of comfort. (I have no contact information for any of you. I hope that will change).

How do you describe a friendship of 56 years? For one thing, its longevity speaks volumes, especially on the part of Angela, who always forgave my lapses, my gaps in communication. The genesis of our friendship began in Grade 6. My mother immigrated to the US which meant I had to move to live with my aunt and family in Brown's Town. Although they were kind to me, I felt I had lost my home, my friends, and my sure footing in the world. Everything felt new. What 10-year-old likes change? To compound my misery, it was the middle of the school year when everyone was established. Miss M. was not friendly when I walked into her already crowded classroom. Before I could compose myself, she called on me, leaving me stuttering and feeling humiliated.

As I wandered forlornly into the school yard at recess, enviously eyeing the friend groups as they let off steam, and wishing I could get my old life back, a girl walked up to me. She had the most expressive eyes and the biggest, whitest teeth I had ever seen. I had to strain my ears to understand her thick British accent. She told me her name was Angela. Her act of coming up to me in my time of loneliness and uncertainty literally changed my life.

And that is Angela: the consummate, thoughtful, phenomenal friend. As a Believer, I have always felt that God has guided me and ordered my steps throughout my life, even when I wasn't aware. It turned out that Angela lived down the road from me. We also went to the same church! We developed a beautiful friendship, whether walking together to school, listening to music in her room, sharing

books, candy or secrets. My family grew tired of me talking about Angela Chambers. They would tease me, saying, "Angela this... Angela that..." Once I cleaned the entire house and cautioned them about their speech because Angela was coming over. One cousin reminds of that to this day! I could trust Angela, and she was always kind and sensitive to the fact that I was afraid of duppies (I had to pass an old graveyard to get home) and that I sometimes missed my mother terribly. When I joined my family in the US, I knew I would never find another friend like her.

There were "lost" years. College, career, motherhood, life, etc. interfered. I was never good at multi-tasking. While I strayed, she was busy being a Proverbs 31 Woman. However, whenever we caught up, it was always like old times. She always chose the positive, never judging me. We had so many laughs reminiscing on our silliness and our Jamaican girlhood.

In our more mature years, we became close on another level. It was great to have a friend who was solidly rooted and grounded in the Word. We would pray with and for each other before saying goodbye on the phone. We would share photos, celebrations, sorrows, and concerns about family and life in general. Your Mom displayed "grace under pressure" in facing life changes such as divorce. And she kept her faith strong in the face of cancer. Imagine having such a diagnosis, yet advocating for changes in the profession with your legislative leaders! That was a profile in courage.

I will miss Angela in so many ways: her soft reassuring voice (still with the British pronunciations), her positive attitude, her solid faith, and her friendship.
