Betty Frazier was born to Henry Cleveland and Pensacola Baldwin on November 6, 1931. She was the oldest of 8 children in the quaint town of McCormick, South Carolina. Betty left her home in the country at the tender age of 15, but not before she accepted Christ as her personal savior at Holy Spring Baptist Church and was baptized. Girded with God and with the intent of finding a better life in New York City, off she went, and succeed - she surely did!

Staying with relatives made it easy for her to continue her education and work in the model industry, as well as other employment sites. Soon after, she married Edward Gibbs (deceased) and together they ran supper clubs and entered the real estate business. From this union she conceived 2 children Denise Gibbs and Edward Gibbs, Jr. Years later, Betty married a second time to Charles Frazier (deceased) who whisked her from city life to the suburbs of Long Island, NY where they raised 4 children; from this union, Eric Frazier and Mona (Frazier) Brawley were conceived. Her third and final marriage was to Robert Settles, a former classmate from McCormick, SC, with whom she traveled the seas as often as possible, cruising and exploring the world in their golden years.

While raising and caring for her family, Betty still wanted to help people; she still had other dreams to fulfill. Therefore, she pursued a degree in the field of respiratory therapy from which she retired. Over the course of her lifetime, she demonstrated her love to serve and help the least of us through her careers in

the New York City Housing Authority and in Hospitals across Long Island and Greenwood SC, as a Respiratory Therapist, as well as a Substitute School Nurse in Georgia.

In her spare time, she often volunteered with the American Cancer Society, Goodwill, The Salvation Army and other organizations. She loved to attend luncheons that contributed to high school students' scholarships, which led Betty to begin mentoring young female students. Her favorite gift to a mentee was assisting the family in receiving a house from Habitat for Humanity in her hometown McCormick, South Carolina.

Eventually, she became a businesswoman, in her own right, as a Travel Agent and Mary Kay consultant. She loved to travel, and thus, traveled extensively within the United States and abroad. She explored places such as Africa, Israel, Europe, her favorite- New Zealand, Hawaii and many many more. Her hobbies included helping seniors, modeling, skiing, fishing, riding in convertible cars, driving cross country, cooking, listening to music, singing and of course traveling. She was a Deaconess at Impact Church where her son-in-law and daughter are pastors. Betty is most known for her graceful, elegant and confident walk; calm demeanor; contagious smile, helping others, her loving ways, flawless skin and her youthfulness. Her next big move was to write her auto biography and cruise once again, this time to the Panama Canal.

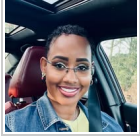

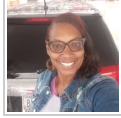
