plate of fish, creamed corn, white rice, vegetarian beans and a slice of white bread. Her Friday meal was not complete without an ice-cold Pepsi.

Betty loved and believed in the Lord. Every Sunday she took her family to her church home, Good Neighbor Baptist Church, where she enjoyed watching her husband as Pastor. At church she was one of the Kitchen Mother's. She was famous for her collard greens, string beans, mac n' cheese, potato salad, sweet potato pie, coconut pineapple upside down cake and banana pudding. And let's not forget Mama's biscuits! She was a responsible church mother and was never late for a Sunday service, while still doing press and curls for her girls and getting dinner ready on Saturday night that it would be ready after church on Sunday.

Betty loved her home in Irvington and soon she and her beloved Robert moved their church home to Fellowship Baptist Church. There she once again became a Kitchen Mother as well as a member of the Usher Board.

Betty had a true love for taking care of children and providing room and board for those in need. And lets not forget her hobby of playing her pick-it and going to the casino, or as she called it, the casina.

As Betty's health began to change, her daughter Amirah stepped in and became her full-time caregiver. She and her husband decided to relocate to Atlanta, where Betty could be Amirah's focus. With a village surrounding her and supporting her, Betty felt like a queen.

Betty was a bossy lady. If it wasn't done her way, it was a problem. She would sit in her chair and direct you on how to make her famous recipes. She also brought some of the old family traditions to the GA home with her. When she could no longer attend church, she would tune in to hear the Good Word from Paster Jimmy Swagger and Joel Osteen. She also loved ordering from her favorite catalog, Stone Berry, and talking on the phone with her family and

close girlfriends.

Betty Lue Gibbs was called home to be with her Lord and Savior on July 8th, 2023. She went peacefully as her daughters, son and granddaughter stood by her side for the last time.
