Life Reflection

Charles Bernard Becton, Jr., known as “Cee,” was born June 8, 1969, in Washington, DC, to the late Charles Bernard Becton, Sr. and Mattie Eva Becton; he was the eldest of their two children. Charles Sr. and Mattie moved their family to Fort Washington, MD, where they worshiped at First Baptist Church of Friendly, and Charles Jr. attended Friendly HS Class of 1987. He was a decorated “star” Varsity Basketball player in high school. He attended Allegheny Community College from 1987 to 1989; while there, “Cee” averaged 18 points and 10 rebounds per game. He led his team to a 32-4 record and an eight-place national ranking. “Cee” earned first team all Maryland JUCO, all district and all-state tournament honors. He was highly recruited by several Division 1 College Programs in Miami, Virginia, Providence, and West Virginia.

Charles “Cee Becton” selected West Virginia University, the 6-foot-7 forward played for the Mountaineers from 1989 to 1991 and was an Atlantic 10 All-Conference Team member in 1990. That season, he averaged 14.1 points per game (14th in the nation), 7.6 rebounds per game (6th in the nation), and 1.5 steals per game (11th in the nation). Charles scored a career-high of 27 points and pulled down a career-high of 14 rebounds that year. It was during this time he met his college sweetheart, Serena Williams. Charles married the love of his life on August 20, 1995. Together, they built a beautiful family blessed

with three children.

After his collegiate career, he moved to Atlanta, Georgia. Charles and his family attended The Fellowship of Faith Church International in EastPoint, GA. Charles was an operations specialist at a local bank for over 20 years, where his diligence and dedication shone. Outside of work, he was a family man who cherished every moment spent with his loved ones. Charles was a faithful member of New Birth Missionary Baptist Church since 2006. Charles B. Becton Jr. was a devoted husband, father, son, brother, and cousin. He transitioned peacefully to be with the Lord on September 6, 2024. Charles was a man of faith, love, and strength whose life was a testament to the grace of God.

Charles enjoyed cooking, grilling, and studying herbal medicines, finding peace in his faith and nature. His love for "Star Wars," all Sci-Fi films, and The Washington Commanders (The RedSkins) was well-known by those close to him. A dedicated believer of Christ, Charles' strong faith guided his actions, always leaving others inspired by his kindness, patience, and ever-present smile. His gentle laugh and warm smile could light up any room, filling it with joy and comfort. Charles was affectionately known to family and friends as the "Gentle Giant."

He is preceded in death by his beloved parents, Charles Sr. and Mattie Becton, grandparents Henry and Mattie Mitchell, and Nathaniel and Carrie Becton. Charles "Cee" leaves to celebrate his life, wife Serena Becton, his sister Cheree (Damon) Lancaster, his children Shanee'(Chad) Willis, Kaylyn Becton, Charles Becton III, his nieces and nephews Armani Becton, Tyree Becton, Sheree Becton, Daron McWilliams, Aamir Becton, Maverick Love and a host of Aunts, Uncles, Dear Cousins, Friends and his beloved Fur babies Kobe-Blu, Kyro and grandpups Liam and Layla.

Charles' memory will remain in the hearts of all who knew him. "Cee," you will forever be missed.
