



Charles Henry Burhanan Sr.

March 31, 1929 - August 8, 2019

Charles Henry Burhanan Sr. was born on Sunday March 31, 1929 in Mercersburg,

Pennsylvania to the late Frank David Burhanan and late Evelyn M. Stoner Burhanan. He was the youngest of 10 children born to this union.

He received his formal education in the Mercersburg School System and graduated from Mercersburg High School.

“Bucky” as has he was affectionately called by everyone who knew him was best

known for his handsome smile, sharp and stylish dress, and great sense of humor.

He also had a passion for singing. Charles and his cousin Billy Jenkins formed a

male quartet singing group called the “Jordan River Boys” which sang all over Pennsylvania, Maryland, and Virginia during his younger years. The group was

best known for performing Christian and Top 40 favorites of that time!

After high school, Charles decided to follow in the footsteps of his three older brothers by enlisting into the Armed Services; he chose to join the United States

Army. Charles started his military career at Camp Beale, California and was later

deployed to Okinawa, Japan during World War II where he served in the 667

th

Ordinance Ammunition Company. He was then sent to Ikego, Japan to organize

an ammunition supply point, and was able to enjoy a little rest and relaxation during his tour in Tokyo, Japan. Upon the completion of his first tour, Charles returned back to the United States and was soon deployed to Inchon/Seoul Korea

to serve in the Korean Conflict. He was a member for the 65 th Ordinance Ammunition Company which assisted the 1 st Marine Division by organizing an

ammunition supply point and the 363 rd and the 33 rd Ordinance Ammunition Companies that receive, shipped, and assembled ammunition in the war zone.

He completed 3 tours of duty during the Korean Conflict by ending his last tour as

a member of the Battery B 376 th ABA BN Company. He returned back to Louisville

Kentucky to finish the remainder of his military service. Charles received a number of military medals, citations, and honors during his time in the United States Army giving 7 years for service to his country.

Charles relocated to Harrisburg, Pennsylvania where he was united in marriage to

the former Shirlean Johnson where they made Harrisburg their home. Their union

was blessed with the birth of two children, Toya, and Charles Jr.

Having accepted the Lord as his personal Savior, he joined Goodwin Memorial

Baptist Church. He later joined Shiloh Church of God in Christ. He served on the

Kitchen Ministry at Goodwin, and served on the Prison Ministry at both

churches.

During his working career, he was a computer programmer/operator at Bethlehem Steel Corporation in Steelton, Pennsylvania until his retirement in 1998.

In his leisure time, Charles particularly enjoyed family gatherings, cook-outs, visiting amusement parks with the family, family vacations, traveling, and loved

listening to jazz and gospel music. His favorite hobbies were cooking, crossword

puzzles, and playing card games.

Charles had a great desire to be closer to his children and their families.

Therefore, a few years after his wife's retirement, they relocated to Grayson, Georgia to spend his later years with his children and grandchildren.

On Thursday August 8, 2019, at his home in Loganville, Georgia, Charles Henry

Burhanan Sr., at the age of 90 years old, peacefully transitioned into eternal rest

surrounded by his loving family and caregivers.

In addition to his parents, Charles was preceded in death by his six sisters, Mary

Burhanan, Janet Lyles, Helen Burhanan, Charlotte Burhanan (at birth), Cleone Hadley, Janet Dorsey, and his three brothers, Samuel, Eugene, and Theodore. He

leaves to celebrate his life and to cherish precious memories of him, his loving wife of 52 years Shirlean Burhanan; his daughter and son-in-law, Toya M. and Harold Davidson of Lawrenceville, GA ; his four sons, Charles Henry Burhanan Jr.
