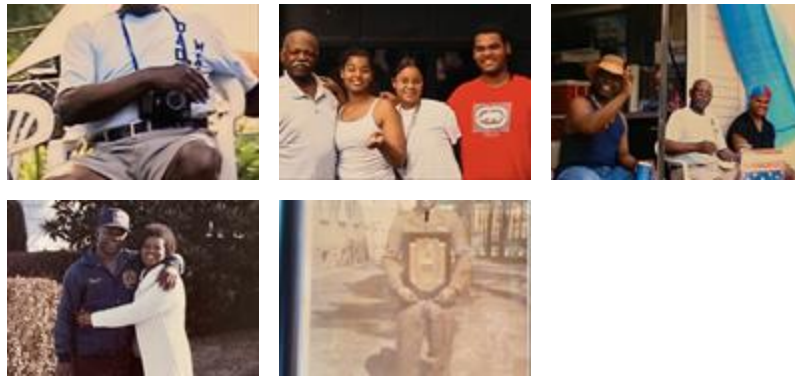

“ I have many fond memories of Mr. Wagner (yes... I'm sixty years old, and I still call him "Mr." Wagner). Respect for elders was one of the life lessons I learned from him growing up next door.

We moved into the house next door to the Wagner's in June of 1971. At the time, I was ten years old and one of the first things I remember was Mr. Wagner speaking to my mom and dad and recruiting me to play for the Bear Cats football team. The following year, I moved to the bantam division and played for the Bobcats. Mr. Wagner, Jim Jones, Mr. Mulgrew and Mr. Van Buren were all our coaches. We were a "bad of brothers." Mr. Wagner was a "task master," demanding only the best of all his players. He taught us the value of hard, self-discipline, sacrifice and teamwork. We didn't know it at the time, but Mr. Wagner was teaching us important life lessons and molding us into the men we would later grow up to be.

I also remember how fun it was to ride to practices at Rippon in the back of his white Ford pick-up truck. Those were simpler times (can you imagine a group of kids riding anywhere in the back of a pick-up truck now?). I also remember the parades through Marumsco Woods that would culminate in a great big community cookout and carnival in the open field next to Ira Dorsey's old Arco Station - then a High's store, before the convenience store it is now.

Mr. Wagner's 4th of July cookouts were the stuff legends were made of! Over the years, his cookouts on the 4th of July became the "social event" of the year in Marumsco Woods and beyond. Mr. and Mrs. Wagner would start planning and cooking days, or even weeks before the big day, and culminate in a full day of fun and friendship. There was plenty of food and drink for all - his ribs were legendary!

Mr. Wagner always took great pride in his lawn and hedges. God forbid he ever caught you cutting through the hedges he worked so hard to maintain!

After I moved away in the late 90's, I would look forward to going over to spend time with Mr. Wagner when I came back to visit. We would simply sit and chat while watching sports. Sometimes we would share a beer together.

I will miss Mr. Wagner... I always thought of Mr. Wagner as a "father figure." He lived a good, long full life and touched so many lives during his time on earth. I like to think that he is with my mom and dad in heaven, playing cards and reminiscing about old times.

My God bless his family and give the the peace and comfort they will need to get through the difficult days ahead.

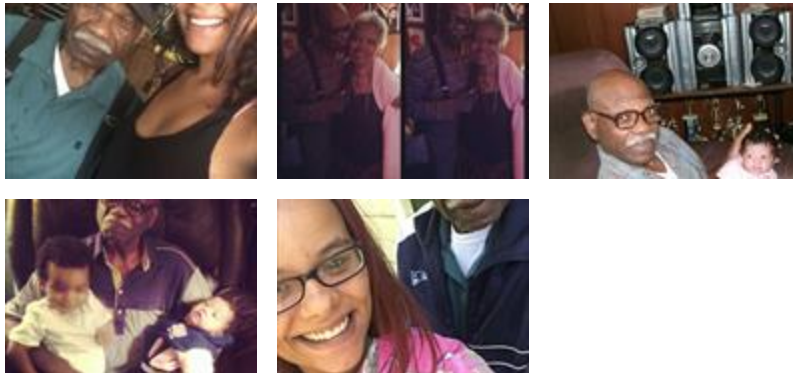
