She was an exemplary alumna of Rust College and outstanding treasurer for the Alumni Rust College Alumni Club during my two year tenure as president (2011-2013).

In 2013 the Club sponsored for the first time in the history of the Club and College "First Regional Conference, Celebrity Gala of Excellence and Hall of Fame Stars."

Our theme was "Historically Black Colleges and Universities: The Role(s) of Alumni in the 21st Century, Helping Students Today By providing Scholarship Opportunities To Become Leaders Tomorrow."

Cheryl went above the "call of duty" and worked tirelessly contributing toward the success of a weekend of scholarly initiatives that focused on providing scholarships for students in the Metropolitan Atlanta Area(s) to attend Rust College.

We received fundraising support from 16 major sponsors and supporters and participating vendors came from 13 businesses and organizations in the Metropolitan Atlanta Area(s).

In part, because of Cheryl, our weekend of scholarly activities resulted in approximately \$35,000 for student scholarship support.

In addition, Cheryl was instrumental in the success of other scholarly alumni fundraising initiatives during my tenure as president such as "Get Paid Cash for your Gold;" Southern Barbecue Cookout, and "A night with Renown Jazz artist, Ms. Francine Reed."

Cheryl was one of God's Angels, a beautiful, loving and kind spirit!

As she looks down on us from heaven, I can hear her saying "Miss Me, But Let Me Go;"
