Clarence D. Horton, age 89 of Snellville, GA, passed away on Saturday, April 9, 2022. He was the beloved husband of Viola Horton for 66 years. Clarence was born in Athens, AL to Eula Bell Hawkins Horton-Leslie and Ulysses Simpson Leslie on February 9, 1933. Upon leaving Athens to join the Army where he fought in the Korean War, he relocated to Newark, NJ after his discharge where he met his wife, Viola Carter. From this union were born their children Stephanie Brantley of Snellville, GA; David Horton (deceased 12/17); Sheilia Horton-Carter of Columbus, OH and Sarah Horton {deceased 10/19}.

Clarence was a pioneer and champion for the civil rights movement and the trucking industry. His life passion to be an entrepreneur relocated him and his family to Vermont and New Orleans.
