



## Mr. Clyde Norman Bennett

April 29, 1942 - October 28, 2024

Clyde Norman Bennett was born on the beautiful Caribbean Island of Trinidad and Tobago, in the city of Woodbrook on April 29, 1942. He was the 5th of seven children (6 boys and 1 girl) born to Norman and Rena Bennett. In Clyde's formative years, he attended Woodbrook E.C. School and in the year of 1950, his family relocated to Success Village Laventille. Clyde also attended Success R.C. School, followed by Progressive Educational Institute High School in Port of Spain, Trinidad, where he graduated with distinction. Upon his graduation, Clyde was immediately hired by British West Indian Airways, where he met and dated the lovely Angela Donnor. Their relationship produced his only biological child Michelle whom he named. Clyde migrated to the USA, to the city of New York in 1967 and was offered a position with the American Cancer Society where he found his niche, and worked with the American Cancer Society for over 30 years until his retirement. During this time, Clyde met and married the love of his life, the gorgeous Marcia Weaver, and became a father to her daughter Jamene. Clyde and Marcia loved and cherished each other for 43 beautiful years. Their love for each other was one to be emulated. Clyde was a great asset and valued to the American Cancer Society, and when the corporate headquarters relocated to Atlanta Georgia, they offered Clyde the opportunity to relocate from New York to Atlanta to help with their transition. After careful consideration with his wife Marcia, they accepted the proposed offer, and became residents of Avondale Estates, Georgia. After settling in Georgia, one of Clyde's greatest joys was relocating

his posterity, (his daughter Michelle, and two precious grand daughters, Melissa and Rena-Marie) from Trinidad and Tobago to Atlanta to be closer to him.

Clyde Bennett was a charming stylish and classy southern/caribbean gentleman. He was a man of integrity and his character reflected how affectionate, dedicated, hardworking, polite, dependable, and generous he was to all. He possessed a quiet and meek disposition, but was always cheerful and in good spirits. He was an immense lover of history, traveling, music and sports, particularly basketball, and he remained a loyal fan to his New York Knicks. Clyde was very intentionally devoted, dedicated, and obedient to his faith and truth, and was a faithful Jehovah's Witness. He invested many years witnessing to others and sharing the love of Jehovah to anyone that would listen. His work on and off the field for Jehovah, strengthen his love for Him. This strong love transferred even to his hospitalization, Bro. Bennett was advised by his medical team that he needed a STAT blood transfusion, but because of his love for Jehovah's truth, he refused to have the procedure.
