Curtis Glover entered into eternal rest on April 15, 2021.

Curtis was born in Brooklyn, NY on October 12, 1949 to the late Richard and Mary

Glover. He had a strong passion for music at an early age. He learned to play the

piano and saxophone, and eventually taught himself to play other wind instruments.

Curtis served in various church ensembles and was often invited to play for weddings and special events.

He joined the Deliverance Evangelistic Center under the leadership of Apostle Arturo Skinner as a youngster and was a member of the Deliverance Orchestra from

1963 to 1975. He taught music to youth in the orchestra as the Lord directed.

He

and his family then joined Faith Fellowship Ministries in 1988, and he played in the

church band until 2009.

Curtis worked in various positions on Wall Street in New York City for 22 years.

His last position before changing careers was as a Mutual Fund Manager at Wall

Street Clearing Company. He then worked as a driver for 15 years until he

retired in
2005.

Curtis met the love of his life, Linda Hairston in 1972. They wed on November 22,

1974. The happy couple lived in New Jersey until they moved to Georgia in 2009.

He was a hopeless romantic, and a loving and devoted husband for 46 years.

He and

his wife had four children, two grandchildren, and two step-grandchildren.

In addition to music, he loved watching movies, baking his infamous peach cobbler

and pistachio cake, bowling and basketball. He took on a recreational youth basketball coaching position for the Police Athletic League (P.A.L.) where he coached his sons' team to a championship. He and his wife loved to entertain their

friends and family at lavish barbeques and parties. He also enjoyed taking road trips

with his wife and kids to visit extended family, amusement parks and vacation destinations.

He was preceded in death by his parents Richard and Mary Glover, brother Reginald Glover and sister Benita Kelly. Left to cherish his memory are his loving

“ It has taken me quite a while to come to this page to read the wonderful tributes left by family and friends. Thank you for leaving such beautiful words and shared memories. I know that if I were to ask everyone who has ever met my Daddy to share some words, I would not be surprised if it was more of the same things you all have mentioned.

Daddy was a tremendous and remarkable man. He has touched the hearts of so many in his life's journey. What everyone saw in public was exactly how he was in private, even when he thought no one was watching. He was always so kind and loving to everyone and put other's needs ahead of his own....a selfless and upright man of God. What an honor it has been to be his daughter. The saying goes, "Any man can be a father, but it takes someone special to be a Daddy." Boy was he special a billion times over. Us kids always had wonderful role models in our parents, and not a day went by without us knowing whether or not they loved us. We were truly blessed for God giving us such loving parents.

I remember growing up dreaming about my father walking me down the aisle to give me away to my future husband. At one point, I was unsure if it would ever happen, because it's very difficult when you have such a great example of man, and most men I met could not hold a candle to my father. I remember watching him woo my mother for as far back as I can remember, and for 40+ years. What an example and high bar he has set for his children's standards in what a man and husband should be. For many years, I believed it was nearly impossible to find someone like my Daddy to live up to those standards, but with prayer and patience, I was able to find someone just as loving, caring and attentive. Many days, my husband does things that reminds me so much of him, and it just melts my heart.

Today, I am about the age my father was when I can remember going to Dorney Park (used to be a summer tradition). He would be so excited to ride those rollercoasters. He'd walk so fast to get from

one to the next. And for some reason, we were convinced that rollercoasters went faster at night, so we'd ride the Hercules over and over towards the end of the day. We'd be at the park from the time it opened until it closed. And sticking with tradition, we'd get ice cream on the way out the park, and as soon as we got to the exit, he'd say, "Wanna race?" Not sure how he wasn't exhausted at the end of that long day, but needless to say, he still had just enough energy to race...and would win for years lol. He was so strong and full of life then. It was hard to think of him any other way, even when he was too weak to feed himself, he was still strong. He fought for every day he lived to the very end. My last memory of him is him telling me how proud he was of me, but me also telling me how proud I am of him. My sister hadn't made it down to Georgia just yet (she drove down), and I asked him to hold on just a little bit longer. He held on just long enough to say his goodbyes to us all. Once he did so, he passed later that evening. Talk about strong!

And if that wasn't enough, anyone that knows him knows that 'Because He Lives' was one of his signature songs to play on his sax. The associate pastor that sang at his service didn't know that, but he said, "God is moving me to sign this song," and proceeded to sing the song. I felt it was my Daddy's final message to let us know that he made it to heaven.

Daddy, though I cry now when I think of you often, I know that grief is love persevering. I'll love you always and forever. Rest in Heaven!
