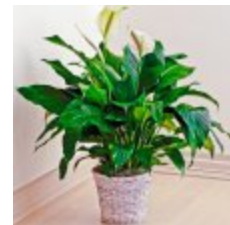

Dottie was a wealth of knowledge and she shared it all with us. She was the guru!

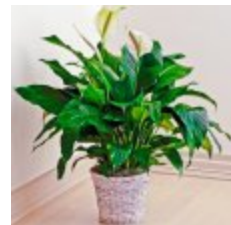
I am saddened she is no longer with us, but I know she's in a place where she's at peace and probably laughing, dancing and telling her stories!
