I will always remember one time when Eddie said he wanted to go out with me after lunch to get rid of a large basketball sized hornet nest at the far end of the parking lot. These were Bald Faced Hornets which are very aggressive. We went out with four cans of wasp spray and soaked the hornet nest down from about 20 feet away, then we left it.
