When I could not make it to his house and called him, the first thing he would say “So when you coming?” The next question would be “How is my girlfriend?” that was referring to my sister, Ingrid who lives in Jamaica, and whom he knew decades before me. He heartily enjoyed her irreverent critiques of his life and wild adventures that always had him laughing and in stitches.

He was generous to a fault, with his knowledge, his food, his home and his friendships were for life. I met many persons at his house who he had known for decades and they all held him in very high regard, and had their own entertaining stories of their respective relationships.

I will miss him a lot – I am sure that every time I head out to onto 285 E, my first thought will be of him, just wondering if I can stop by quickly to say hi and share a few laughs.

But for now, I will just say on behalf of my husband, children, and siblings, all of whom loved and enjoyed Eric greatly “ Eric, walk good... there are many on that side welcoming you right now, and there will be nuff laughing and “palaav”, I am sure. As for us on this

side, we will cherish the memories and keep going until we meet again”.

I pray for comfort for my cousins, Aunt Pearl and all the other friends and family that are feeling this loss. I think Eric would want us to Live, Love, Eat and Laugh to our fullest.

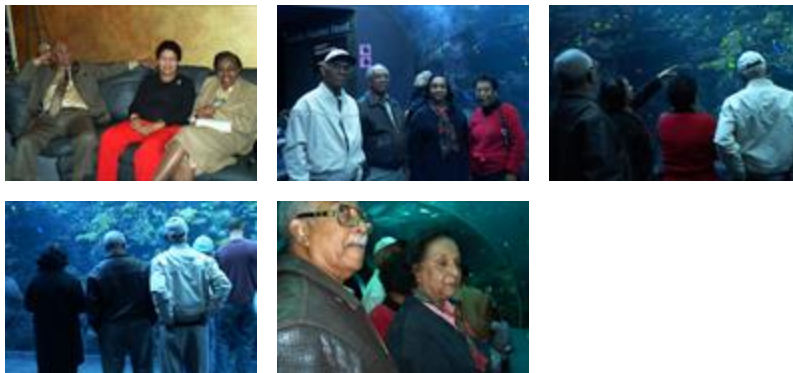
