They would spend hours in the same space, just chilling.

On May 13, 2025, she underwent open-heart surgery. Afterward, she dedicated herself to getting better. Every day was a struggle, but she made it through each one miraculously. On May 14, 2026, she took her last breath, sleeping peacefully.

Erin lived life on her own terms. She was an amazing mother, an even better grandmother, a loving sister, a beautiful friend, a ride-or-die Tee Tee, and everything in between.

She was Erin. She was direct. She wanted it her way, on her time, simply because she said so.
