



Franklin C. Monroe Sr.

February 10, 1943 - November 3, 2020

On Tuesday November 3, 2020, Franklin C. Monroe Sr., passed away in Conyers, Georgia at the age of 77. Franklin was born in Richmond, VA. He enlisted in the United States Army at the age of 22 and served 24 years as a Combat Medic and Army Practical Nurse. He served in the Vietnam War and received both Bronze and Silver Service Stars as well as various other medals and commendations. After retiring from the military, he worked as a Licensed Practical Nurse in Columbus, Georgia and volunteered at Martin Army Community Hospital, Fort Benning, Georgia.

Franklin loved to travel and enjoyed visiting museums and learning about history. He enjoyed listening to jazz and was a self-described movie buff.

He was preceded in death by his parents Andrew J. Monroe Sr and Marie E. Monroe; his siblings, James Monroe, Andrew Monroe Jr., Alice Shelton, Carol Monroe, and his former spouse, Ernestine Monroe.

He is survived by his three children, Franklin Jr, Denise and Pamela, three granddaughters, Melody, Tanisha and Brianna and two sisters Elenora Archer and Ethel Gaynor Johnston.
