See him as light.

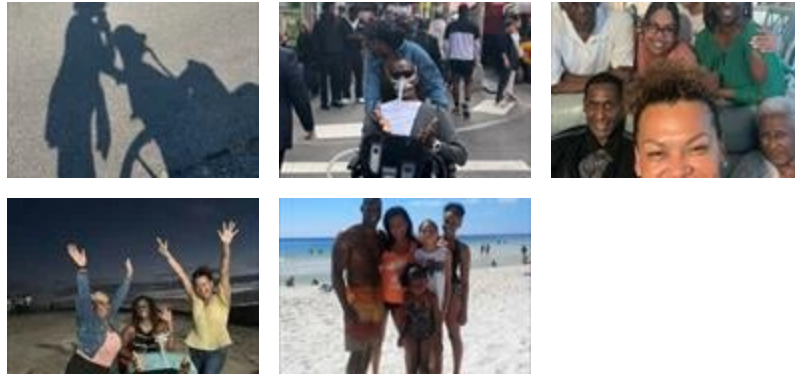
*And when you feel love rise unexpectedly—

thank you.*

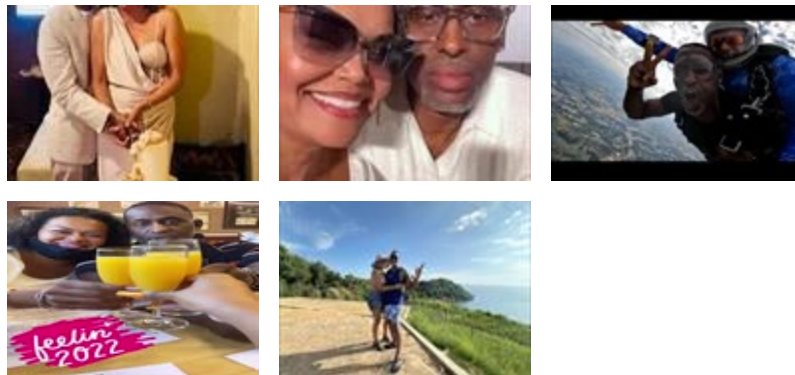

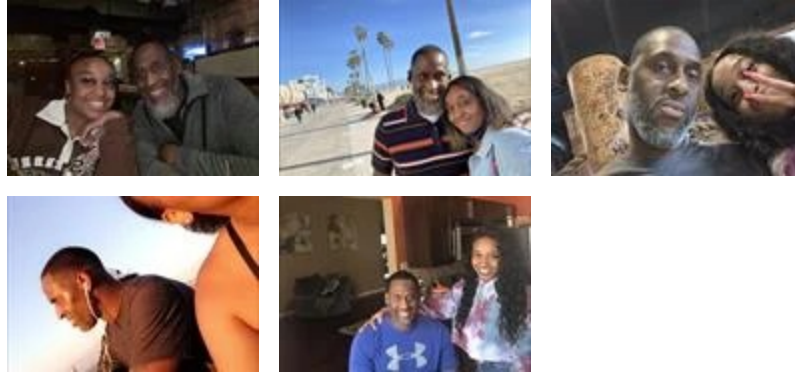

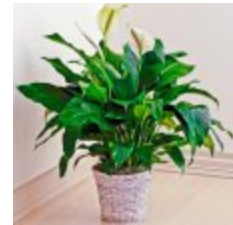
