



Gladys Case

August 8, 1942 - January 20, 2021

On the eve of August 8th 1942, Gladys Case was born to Jestina and James Michael in Kingston Jamaica. Gladys was the fifth child of six children born to Jestina and James. She had 2 sisters and 3 brothers; Mavis, Gabriel, Solomon, Shirley, Gladys and Joseph. All preceded her in death. Gladys was the last surviving member of her generation and the Matriarch of our Family. Gladys loved all her siblings but she was particularly close to her brother Joseph, affectionately known as Uncle Joe. When Mom shared stories about her childhood she would often reminisce about playing competitive games of marbles and dominoes with Uncle Joe.

Gladys met Trevor Case and they married on January 8, 1972. Together they raised 7 children. Roger, Mark, O'Neil, Hurlstone, Camille, Nicole and Sean. Gladys and Trevor emigrated to the United States in 1978. She worked several different jobs before she settled down at Mount Sinai Hospital in Manhattan. Her career spanned over 2 decades as a Certified Nursing Assistant on a Cardiac Unit. Mom would bring home stories of rich and sometimes famous people that came to have surgery. She even secured an autograph for us a time or two.

Mom was a remarkable woman who touched many people. She was loved not only by family but by the people who came to know her. Over the years some people came to regard her as a second mother including Bobby and Richard.

Gladys and Trevor were also foster parents to 4 boys. They impacted their life tremendously at a time when they needed love and guidance the most. The boys often visited long after they were no longer under their care. An important thing to understand about Mom was that she was not raised with her mother. She lost her mother at a young age. She did not have the benefit of a mother's guidance to usher her through significant milestones. She had to learn many life lessons on her own, and this shaped the woman she would become. Mom's focus was always on her family, whether it was taking trips, family barbecues or holiday gatherings. She also looked forward to visiting her native island of Jamaica whenever she could.

Once retired, Mom became more politically conscious. She enjoyed watching political commentary especially CNN and was fortunate to see Bill Maher live.

Gladys transitioned on January 20th 2021. She is survived by 6 children (Mark, O'Neil, Hurlstone, Camille, Nicole and Sean) 20 grandchildren (Nassieve, Tanisha, Phylcia, Tysheen, Nicholas, Anton, O'Neil, Nadiera, Osav, Gabrielle, Ryan, Roger, Tristan, Briana, Aiden, Devin, Jayden, Ethan, Dylan and Lauren); and 8 Great Grandchildren (Anicia, Amaya, Matthew, Antonio, Alana, Kyrie, Zhymier and Zaelyn). She leaves behind a long legacy, great memories and traditions that we remember fondly such as the infamous Christmas Cake and Dahl.
