



## Gloria Monday Rose Dingle

May 16, 1925 - March 23, 2024

Gloria Monday Rose Dingle was born May 16, 1925, to the union of William and Beulah Little Monday.

Proceeded in death by her Father William Monday, Mother Beulah Little Monday, Brothers James William Monday and Richard Monday; Sisters Norma Washington and Lavon (Toni) Franklin, Daughter Aletha Jean Rose Gray.

She joined Bethel A.M.E. Church in Omaha NE, and accepted Jesus Christ as her personal Savior at an early age.

Gloria was invited in marriage to Frank E. Rose (deceased) and from that union was born Aletha Jean and Edwin A. Rose.

In 1960 she was invited in marriage to George Dingle, Jr. US Air Force of Savannah GA (deceased). To their union was born Jeffery George Dingle, and son Howard Leon Dingle, who joined their family following the death of his beloved Mother.

She was educated in the Omaha Public School System and her employment started with a position as a Riveter on B-29 Bombers at Offutt Air Force Base in Omaha NE during World War II. After the War, her employment continued with Douglass County, NE Assessor, Omaha City Finance Department, Nebraska State Human Development, Riverside CA Schools, and Riverside CA County Assessor's Office, where she retired.

Gloria lived in Riverside CA after her husband's military retirement from 1972 to 1994. There she joined Allen Chapel A.M.E. in Riverside CA and served as

a Steward, Trustee, Treasurer of Zeola Jones Auxiliary and member of the Second Unit of Missions until the passing of her husband, George Dingle, Jr. in 1994. She then returned to Omaha NE to take care of her mother, Beulah Monday until her death. During that time, she served at Bethel A.M.E. Church as a Steward, Trustee and a member of the Missionary Society. Upon the death of her mother in 2002, Gloria moved to Atlanta GA to live with her son Jeffery Dingle including three years in Columbia MD with him and his family, before returning to Atlanta. While in Georgia, she joined Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church.

The joy of her life was always God, and her personal Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. As well as her children, family, church, and friends. Her hobbies were sewing, and needle crafts.

She is survived by sons Edwin A. Rose of Omaha NE, Howard L. Dingle and Jeffery Dingle of Atlanta GA, 11 Grandchildren, 11 Great Grandchildren, many beloved nieces and nephews, cousins and many cherished friends.

Gloria Monday Rose Dingle leaves an amazing legacy of faith, love, and service; but also, one of diligence, planning and foresight. She truly modeled Jesus Christ in her daily life. She prepared her loved ones for her passing by saying very often over the later years of her life that she was "ready to be with the Lord". She urged us all to "not be sad" upon her passing because she "will be with the Lord". She also urged her family to not "hover over or pay attention to" her body upon her transition, saying "I won't be there!" She left her family a handwritten note telling us she loved us and told us to continue to love one another, and to "say it often". She made preparations and left clear instructions for us upon her transition, including writing the text of this Obituary and expressing her desires for a Memorial Service. Services will be held at Forest Lawn Funeral Home, 7909 Mormon Bridge Road, Omaha, NE 68152, followed by "some sort of cookout or picnic where you can all gather together and laugh". Therefore, we shall do just exactly that.
