*How do you say goodbye to a father, friend, brother, uncle, husband? How do you?*

*Bro. Weir, as we called him, was one of those to each one who knew him.*

*During the era when St. Mary fell within the territory of Central Jamaica Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, Bro./Elder Hernell Hamlin Weir gave 30 years of dedicated, outstanding, and sacrificial service to the growth of the work in the parish of St. Mary, and in particular, in the Geddes Mountain and Oracabessa communities.*

*At the Geddes Mountain Church, he served for 10 years as an enthusiastic Choir Director, Musician, and Personal Ministries Leader. Under his leadership, as a Musician and Choir Director, the Geddes Mountain Church Choir became the envy of many congregation in and out of Seventh-day Adventist Circle. They were the ‘sort after’ choir for many church functions. As Personal Ministries Leader, He used every day was an opportunity to conduct Bible studies and to do visitations. On foot, he was seen knocking on gates visiting and sharing the word. He led by example and the church followed.*

*In 1979, the late Don Crowder conducted an eight weeks crusade in Oracabessa. That effort gave birth to the Oracabessa Church. Bro. Weir was asked to serve as the First, Head Elder, Musician, and Choir Director for this new congregation. This position he held for 20 years. With added vigour and enthusiasm, he walked tirelessly, from*

*Geddes Mountain to Oracabessa on Sabbaths, with his bag of “sugar cane and pudding” every Sunday and Wednesday night for Evangelistic and Prayer meetings. Hi faith would lead him on many other days on that journey up and down the mountains for other church-related meetings, church visitations and Bible studies.*

*His ministries had no age limits. He loved the youths and loved to be present in their meetings to give instructions, directions, or just to support. Many of these young people, are still actively serving the church today and they credit their love for God and the Church to the nurturing they received from Bro. Weir. He would rejoice when they were successful and would tearfully go in search of any that were missing. He was not afraid to cry openly and declare his desire to serve God. His love for music went beyond the piano and the church choir to his sermons. Many times, his messages would be punctuated with songs. Under his leadership the church grew tremendously.*

*Bro. Weir will not only be remembered for his handsome face, approachable persona, and pleasant countenance, but for:*

*His exemplary leadership*

*His commitment to the work of Christ*

*His love for people*

*His concern, care, and compassion for the less fortunate*

*He has answered the call of the Life Giver. Today we give God thanks for his faithful ministry. We take hope in the resurrection. Bro. Weir knew the Master who holds keys of death and hell. At the appropriate time He will open the graves not only for Bro. Weir, but for all who know Him.*



“ On behalf of the Pastor, and members of the Oracabessa S.D. A Church, please accept our sincere Condolences.

*It was Thomas Campbell who said "To live in the hearts of those that we leave behind is not to die." Therefore we are gathered here today in the memory of our dear brother Weir, so that together we may acknowledge and share both our joy in the gift that his life was to us, and the pain that his passing brings. In those good old days there were no taxis, so on foot Elder Weir would travel to Oracabessa from Geddes Mountain at least three times per week, and sometimes four. With a smile on his face and a song on his heart he would gladly go on God's errands.*

*Brother Weir knew each and every member of his congregation by name. He shared excellent relationship with his members regardless if you were young or old. He knew each of us like a book, and was quick in picking up when a member was troubled or unhappy. He had the interest of everyone at heart. Brother Weir would always take his lunch to church, but before he sat down to eat, he would go from group to group or individual to individual to make sure everyone was eating. When he was satisfied he would sit down to eat. He enjoyed chatting with his members, as he tried to make sure their minds were stayed on heaven. Many Sabbaths he had to be monitored, to make sure he had his lunch, or he would spend the entire lunch period talking with anyone or everyone instead of eating. He enjoyed talking about his wife Miss May and his two children.*

*There were some sayings of brother Weir that we can never forget.*

- 1. Parents load the gun and the children pull the trigger.*
- 2. Brethren we must all work together, so that we can say we all kill the bear*

*There were many wonderful aspects to Elder Weir's life, and many ways that he touched our lives. Elder Weir would be the last person to leave the church compound on a Sabbath. He would stay there until the last person leaves. Then he made his way home. He will be remembered as a wonderful brother, a great leader, a generous person, and a true friend.*
