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Kareem Ali was born Anthony Mobley on October 18, 1948 to Mr. and Mrs. William (preceded in death) and Dorothy Mobley. Kareem was one four siblings that included older brother and sister, Billy (William Jr.) and Patricia, and younger brother Rodney (preceded in death).

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Kareem was born and raised in Queens, New York. In the 1960's when Kareem was a teenager the family moved to Decatur, Georgia. His sister, Patricia, remembers him growing up as a gentle spirit, quiet and observant but readily expressing affection and quick to say, I love you.

Kareem was an avid lover of sports but boxing and basketball were his favorites and he continued to play basketball throughout his entire life. Growing up he often shared stories with his children about his New York days and playing basketball with a neighborhood friend, Lew Alcindor; who he not only shared a love of basketball but also the same name, as 'Lew' grew up to be the well-known Kareem Abdul Jabbar.

In 1975 Kareem relocated to Michigan at which time he met a host of life-long friends one of which included his future wife, Makini Ahket. Of this union they had 3 beautiful children, Enid Mahasin, Hayat Muneerah, and Tariq Mustafa. After separating and the passing of his father Kareem moved back to Georgia to be closer to his mother, whom he was very close to and shared a special love.

Kareem was a deeply spiritual and politically minded man who studied the Quran, Dr. Yosef Alfredo Antonio Ben-Jochannan, referred to by his admirers as "Dr. Ben", and many other leaders within the African-American and Islamic Community. He was also very health and fitness conscious. Kareem followed a vegetarian diet for over 40 years and rarely missed an opportunity to work out.

He was a firm believer in "your body is your temple".

Kareem also never missed an opportunity to mentor not only youth, but the community at large. Most recently he "discovered" Facebook which he found to be a great platform to pass on a wealth of knowledge and information, from culture and history, to religion and politics. He covered it all. Kareem was a great example that knowledge comes from learning and studying and wisdom is earned through the observation and living of a very full life. He mastered both.

He is survived by his three children, Enid (Eric) Ali-Reed, Hayat (George) Ali-Duncan and Tariq Ali, his mother; Dorothy Mobley, siblings; Patricia Mobley and Billy (Sandra) Mobley, nieces; Dorothy (Christopher) Burton and their children, Kieshawn (Marquis) Ford and their daughters, and Stacy and her family; nephews, Curtis (preceded in death) and Mark and his family, his grandchildren Amber Zuri, Yasmin Zoe, Xavier, Justin, and Shaddai, the mother of his children, friend, and ex-wife Makini Ahket, a special friend; Carol Rowe, as well as a host of other relatives and close friends.
