Celebrating the Life of Knoxice Camellia Hunter, Ph.D.

Dr. Knoxice Camellia Hunter, the eldest of three children, was born on July 28, 1958, to the late Randolph.(Dee) Hunter, Sr. and Bonnie Atkinson Hunter in Atlanta, GA. She went home to be with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, early on Sunday morning, January 14, 2024.

Knoxice was a graduate of the 1976 Class of Frederick Douglass High School in Atlanta, GA. She went on to complete her undergraduate degree in psychology at Emory University in 1979.

While at Emory, Knoxice was one of the charter members of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority -- the first Black sorority on Emory's campus.

She received her master's degree in 1982 and her Ph.D. in 1984 from the University of Georgia.

Passionate about mental healthcare, Knoxice pursued a career in clinical psychology. She retired from United Health Care as a Clinical Psychologist after more than 30 years of practice.

She was also known to counsel family and friends, so as a result, they brought many of their challenges to her for advice. She never hesitated to help.

Knoxice's home was her haven. One of her favorite pastimes was interior decorating, something she also enjoyed doing with her sister and brother. The Hunter siblings were all avid movie buffs and loved candlelight dinners. There was no better place to be as a family than just being in each other's company.

Knoxice was a beautiful, stylish, vivacious, strong, and independent woman. She loved to entertain and share a loving space as often as she could with family, friends, and colleagues in her beautiful home. She was a warm, kind and welcoming energy to all she met.

Knoxice, above all things loved God and her family, especially her sister Jeaneen and brother Randy. After their parents transitioned, Knoxice took on the role as family matriarch, giving advice, direction and pouring out loads of affection. Knoxice also loved her fur babies, first Max and then Mia, the current 100+ pound Alaskan Malamute.

Warm and beautiful memories will be cherished by her loving sister Jeaneen Hunter, brother, Randolph (Randy) Hunter, Jr., fur baby Mia; a loving and caring uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. James W. Hunter (Mary Alice); cousin Guestus Mack, who was more like a brother; relatives of the Hunter, Mack and Curry families and a host of close friends and colleagues.
