“ Our family was so fortunate to have Linda in our home for an hour or so each week for the last year and a half. Linda, with endless patience, grace, caring, and intelligence, was my son's math tutor. She was also much more than that. She was on our " team" and helped our son , and my husband and I, negotiate the first year of middle school at a new school. She discussed study strategies, school strategies , and kept in touch during the week. She was the first person my son wanted to contact with news of a good test grade. In my son' s words " I made C- s on my math tests and then after Linda started helping me I made A- s." Linda wrote thorough and extremely helpful summaries with study recommendations after each meeting with my son. She also didn't keep to her scheduled " hour" . Frequently, she stayed until he mastered the concept they were working on. Linda's knowledge of all the different permeatations of learning differences and the way they manifested in various subjects was truly amazing.

Linda liked our dogs - and they rushed to greet her each week. She didn't mind a dog sleeping on her feet while she taught our son. She never judged. She was warm and kind and fit right in with our family. I could tell her when it had been a bad day. I think she could let me know the same.

Linda talked about her love of tennis and her spring breaks in Hilton Head when she got to play tennis everyday. Sometimes she would talk a bit about NY. She talked about how the new technology meant her former students sometimes skyped her for help from college :)

Linda rescheduled one tutoring session and was late for a second. We knew something must be very very wrong. Most of us reschedule things.... Run late.... But Linda didn't. The day she was late she tracked me down at work via phone so i could call my son (who was at home) to let him know she would be late. I heard noise in the background- she didn't quite sound like herself - but she was thinking about my son at a time that must have been enormously

stressful for her.

We have been shocked and saddened by her quick passing. We miss her very much and would like to express our deepest sympathy to Linda's family and loved ones.
