After graduating high school, Luther enlisted in the armed services. He served two tours of duty in World War II. Bill and graduated from Tougaloo College with a Bachelor's Degree. He continued his education at the University of Chicago where he earned his Master's Degree in Social Work.

He was a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity and the Veterans of Foreign wars.

Luther began his professional career as a social worker for the state of Illinois. He worked at the state level for several years. He later decided to move to the federal level where he continued his profession in the field of social work.

As a form of relaxation, Luther enjoyed fishing with his son, nephews, nieces, family, and friends. Shortly after Luther and his wife moved to Atlanta, his son surprised him with his own boat, not an easy task to keep secret, but his son, Luther Charles, with the help of other relatives was successful in keeping it a surprise.

Luther also enjoyed playing golf with family and friends. His love of golf spanned over 50 years. Luther also enjoyed tournaments where he pushed himself to improve his game.

He was a classic handyman. Luther was always using his creative talents to improve life for his family.

Furthermore, Luther appreciated the intrinsic joy of serving his community. He gladly served as a Scoutmaster in the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) in Chicago impacting the lives of many including his son and grandson. Because of his exposure to scouting, his son developed a love for engineering and made it into a career. Additionally, his grandson earned his Eagle Scout Badge. In addition to community service, Luther served in several church capacities at Cascade United Methodist Church, including the Board of Trustees during the move to the church's current location.

He was also a member of the Celebration of Life Ministry and the Older Adults-Torchbearers Ministry.
