Lynda Ruth had a lively personality. She was both sugar and spice and was often the life of the party. She loved hard and she believed that love wins. She was an avid supporter of the LGBT Community and she loved to attend shows and pageants.

Her sisters were everything to her. She believed in family over everything. She

enjoyed food and loved everything from caviar to soul food. She had an exquisite pallet and a strong appetite. In her kitchen you could always find an array of snacks and Coke!

We will miss her smile, her big fluffy hair, her loud TV, the vabrotta in her strong alto voice, her eye rolls and warm hugs. She was a light, our light. She believed and lived in God's word and radiated His love. She would want everyone to know that she is now resting with her father.

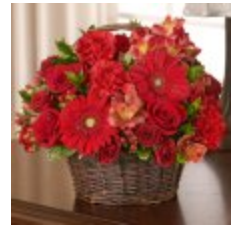
