



## Mabsolyn Angalita Edwards

June 13, 1941 - August 25, 2024

Mabsolyn was born on June 13, 1941, to Mavis and Sigisman McCalla in Bellas Gate, St. Catherine, Jamaica. She attended Bellas Gate Primary School and, as a child, found joy in attending Sabbath services with her grandmother. Though she faced childhood challenges, including serious bouts of malaria, Mabsolyn's spirited personality shined all the way through. She was known for being feisty and cheeky, always insisting on having the last word.

In the late 1950s, her father moved to England as part of the Windrush generation. Mabsolyn joined him in 1962, settling in Birmingham. There, she worked at a button and pin factory. It was at a cousin's wedding that a persistent suitor named Rollin Wade Edwards, affectionately known as "Doc," caught her eye. Despite her initial reluctance, Doc's persistence paid off, and they married in 1964. Their union was blessed with beloved sons Errol, Junior, and Philip.

In 1982, the family immigrated to the United States, with the help of Doc's brother, Louzan. They initially stayed at their Aunt Dell's apartment in the Bronx before moving into an apartment of their own. Mabsolyn studied to become a nurse's aide, excelling in her work. She took on two jobs, caring for the elderly with dedication at Eastchester and Split Rock Nursing Homes. Her tireless efforts led to the family purchasing their first home on Baychester

Avenue, a moment of pride for Mabsolyn, Rollin, and the children.

As the years passed, Mabsolyn became a devoted grandmother, a role she embraced wholeheartedly. In 1989, she welcomed her first grandchild, Jonathan, and later, three beautiful granddaughters, Jodi, Brienne, and Alexis. Mabsolyn was always there for her family, offering endless love and support, especially when it came to her grandchildren, who she moved to Georgia to be with in 2008.

Throughout her life, family was her top priority, and she believed in helping anyone in need. Her deep faith guided her, and she was a devoted member of the Seventh Day Adventist Church, attending services in Jamaica, England, and the USA. Her home was always full of love, laughter, and delicious food, especially on Sundays when she cooked for her family.

Mabsolyn is survived by her sons, Errol (wife, Tawana), Junior, and Philip; her grandchildren, Jonathan (wife, Shenel), Jodi, Brienne, and Alexis; her great-grandchildren, Marlee, Klay, Aiden, and Elaina; and numerous other family members who will continue to honor her memory.
