Mae Eva Wesley was born on January 19, 1948 in Atlanta, GA to the late Mr. Mose Wesley and Mrs. Eva Mae Howe Wesley. Her two late brothers: Mr. Roosevelt Wesley and Jesse Milton Wesley preceded her in death.

She was educated in the city of Atlanta, Georgia attending Gideons Elementary and graduating from Luther Judson Price High School class of 1967 where she graduated with honors. Her education continued at Clark College where she joined Phi Chapter, Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority. In 1972, she graduated from Clark College with a BA Degree in Business Administration.

Her career started at Western Union Telegraph Company as an Administrative Assistant where she served for 12 years. This position ended when it was transferred to Upper Saddle River, New Jersey. On August 11, 1987, she was hired by the Fulton County Purchasing Department. At Fulton County she served 22 years in the following positions: Administrative Assistant, Buyer, Senior Buyer and Procurement Officer.

Mae Eva is an active member of Eta Sigma Chapter Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority—the Heart and Soul of Atlanta. She served as secretary of the sorority for several years. Also, she was a member of the American Business Women's Association.

She is a member of Mount Carmel Baptist Church and sings with the T Flemming Mass Choir. Her Pastor is the well-known singer, author, teacher, and preacher, the Reverend Timothy Flemming, Sr.

In October of 2016, she was diagnosed with Lymphoma at Emory Hospital in Decatur, Georgia. Lymph nodes were found in her pelvis, chest and neck. After treatment for two years, her health improved.
