On June 30th, 2020, Marion L. Cloud, Sr., passed away peacefully at home at the age of 76 with his loved ones by his side. Marion was born in Atlanta, Georgia on December 28, 1943 to the late David Cloud and the late Flossie Mae Davis Cloud -Crowder.
