Reverend Marjorie Hale, an ordained minister was recognized as a devoted prayer warrior, an intercessor, teacher, facilitator and speaker at Women's Conferences and Retreats. She was a strong women of God who allowed His glory to penetrate her spirit and surroundings even in the most troubling times. She connected with everyone around her. Rev. Marjorie loved people and encouraged them to develop to their full potential. She was a sounding board for many always providing an open ear and loving shoulder to cry on.

A native of Kingston, Jamaica in the West Indies, Marjorie was born to Mrs. Alrica Evans Nurse and Mr. Lloyd Bakour Myrie. At an early age Marjorie accepted Christ and became active in the church where she taught Sunday School and worked with the youth. Before the age of twenty-one she moved to the US and lived several years in the state of New York.

Marjorie received a B.A. Degree in Sociology from Brooklyn College and an MBA in Finance from Long Island University. Marjorie moved to Georgia

where she joined Saint Phillip A.M.E. Church. She later met and married Ezell Hale. She received a Master of Divinity from Turner Theological Seminary on the campus of the Interdenominational Theological Center (ITC) in Atlanta, GA. In May 1999, Reverend Hale was ordained an Itinerant Elder of the African Methodist Church.

Reverend Hale served on the ministerial staff at Saint Phillip A.M.E. Church under the leadership of then Senior Pastor Reverend George Moore where she was active in Adult Church School, Bible School, New Members Orientation, the Prayer Ministry, the Ministry to Women and the Rites of Passage for Young Ladies.

At the Greater St. Peter A.M.E. in Jonesboro, Ga. where Reverend Isaiah Waddy is Senior Pastor, Reverend Hale served as Assistant Pastor. She oversaw various ministries and was responsible for the new member recruitment and retention.

In July of 2006 God directed Reverend Hale to Newnan, Ga where she was appointed Senior Pastor of Wesley Chapel A.M.E. Here she was a dedicated pastor, teacher, and friend until 2011. Reverend Hale prayerfully considered it privileged to take on responsibilities and services as a leader. She was humbled and honored to serve a faithful congregation.

Reverend Hale memory, faithful and courageous spirit shall continue to live on through those that love her, devoted husband, Ezell Hale, Muriel Whittaker (aunt whom raised Marjorie from two months to time coming to the states), Sharon Fowler (sister whom Marjorie raised once getting to the states), Avriel Spence ("bestest" friend), siblings, aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces, nephews, pastors, church members, neighbors, co-workers, prayer partners, brothers and sisters in Christ, and a long list of dedicated and devoted family and friends.
