Not only do we have physical life because of you, but because of you and Dad loving Jesus and living out a Christian example the best you could, we came to know Jesus Christ personally early in life, and He changed our lives too. We know that your burning desire was that all your family and friends would know Jesus like we do. Your prayer would be that those who are not God's children, who have never had a life change, will ask Him to save them from their sins today. You loved telling people about Jesus, and God used you as the best missionary by being our mother. You have not only been our mother, but our best friend growing up.
