The late Maude Leila Hemiedi Jones was born on November 10, 1956 onto the union of the late Roland Lenox Jones and Annie Mensah Jones in Cavalla, Firestone, Maryland County.

Affectionately called Mimmie girl, she attended the Firestone plantation elementary school and later matriculated to Monrovia to live with her Aunt Mrs. Joetta Kemokai where she attended the B.W. Harris Episcopal school. Upon her returned to Cape Palmas she attended the St. Francis School in Pleebo

and later enrolled at Our Lady of Fatima High school in Harper, Maryland County where she graduated. Maude attended the University of Liberia where she obtained a Bachelor of Arts(BA) degree in Public Administration. She was a prominent member of the Providence Baptist church in Monrovia where she served in various auxiliaries including the Sunday school, choir, usher board and women department. Maude relocated to the United States of America where she lived with her cousin Alfred Jones in Staten Island, New York.

The devout Christian that Maude was, she quickly joined the First Central Baptist church of Staten Island, NY. where she served in various departments including the choir, usher board, and women department.

While living in Staten Island Maude worked with the State of New York assigned to the Staten Island Developmental Disability Society Office(SIDDSO) as a Developmental Specialist.

She later relocated to Lawrenceville, Georgia to join her Niece Joan Jones

Vermon and Cousin Ora Bruce. She joined the shiloh AME Zion Church where she later got ordained as a deaconess. She was employed with Gwinnett county school system and worked at Arcardo and Rockbridge elementary schools. Maude later joined Rock Springs elementary school where she worked as a special education paraprofessional until her death. She was a member of Christ the king baptist church. Maude is survived by her children , grand children, siblings and a host of other relatives and friends.
