William James Battle, II was born November 5, 1937 in Birmingham, Alabama. He graduated high school from Holy Family Catholic School. Upon graduation from high school, he joined the US Navy where is served as a pipe fitter and was on the Naval boxing team. William graduated from California State in Los Angeles where he played football and baseball. Upon graduation, he signed with the San Francisco 49s where he played one season. After his football career, he worked for Arco Oil and Ford Motor Company. William left Ford after receiving an opportunity to run an American Motor's Dealership in New York. He later moved to Georgia to be with his family where he owned a service station in Decatur and Atlanta which he sold after receiving an offer to acquire a Ford Dealership in Augusta, GA. Mr. Battle was the first African American to own a Ford Dealership in Augusta. In 1986, Mr. Battle returned to Decatur where he started Battle & Battle Distributors, which remains in existence since it's inception. Mr. Battle has served on the Dekalb County Juvenile Panel, on the Board of the South Dekalb Credit Union, and is an active member of Greenforest Baptist Church where he is member of the Brotherhood Choir and the Veteran ministry. Celebration of Life Services for Mr. William James Battle II of Stone Mountain, Ga. will be held Tuesday, August 11, 2009, 12:00 p.m. at Greenforest Community Baptist Church, Decatur, Ga.
