Nathaniel (“Smokey”, “Johnell”, “Nate”, “John”) Washington, Sr. was born to the late Nathan Washington and Alberta Harris Washington on August 19, 1936 in New Orleans, Louisiana.

Nathaniel accepted the Lord and was baptized at Ebenezer Baptist Church by the late Reverend Lawrence Landrum, Sr. in New Orleans, LA. At Ebenezer he worked with Pastor Landrum ministering to the sick in hospitals and nursing homes. He became a member of the Mt. Nathaniel also worked as a driver working for Quest Diagnostics Laboratory delivering and picking up specimen as well as a Driver in the transportation services provided by his daughter

Denise's child care services in Atlanta.

Nathaniel also worked for more than five years as a freelance photographer alongside his brother-in-law, Arthur, working at weddings, parties and special events. He was a life time member of the Longshoremen Labor Union and worked as a union organizer.

He went home to be with the Lord on March 25, 2015. His favorite scripture was the 23rd Psalm. His favorite hymns were Walk around Heaven All Day and Stand by Me.

He was a fun loving man, generous of spirit and kind to everyone. He never met a stranger. Everyone knew he was the first, last and only die hard Saints fan. The apples of his eye are Denise, John-John, his grandchildren, Ashley, Dominique, and Shawntrice, as well as his great grandson, Bentley Nathaniel. Nathaniel was preceded in death by his parents, Nathan and Alberta Harris Washington, son, Nathaniel ("John-John"), brothers, Herman and James Washington, and sisters, Dorothy W. Caliste, Bertha W. Hall, and Roseanna W. Nash. He is survived by his wife of 59 years, Doris Simpson Washington, daughter, Denise W.
