Nuckols was born on April 8, 1950 in Chicago, IL to the union of the late Morris Martin Nuckols and the late Marjorie McCray Nuckols. She was the 2nd child born to that union. Renee was raised in a Christian home and accepted Christ as her personal Savior at age 10. She was baptized at Berean Baptist Church by the late Rev. C.D.L. Bradshaw and faithfully attended Sunday School and Church while serving in the William S. Bradden Choir until she relocated to Georgia to attend college. Renee was educated in the Chicago Public School system, graduating from McCosh Elementary and Englewood High School. It was at Englewood that she met the Love of Her Life, William G. Shackelford, Jr. - whom she affectionately called Shack at that time. In 1969, Renee left Chicago and relocated to Atlanta, GA to attend Clark College. William was already a student at Clark, a possible motivating factor precipitating the move and choice of schools! In August 1970, William and Renee were united in Holy Matrimony. To that union 3 children were born: Dionne, Lenise, and Andre. Her husband and children were her pride and joy. While raising a family, Renee continued her education and earned a Master of Arts from Atlanta University and a Doctorate of Education from Clark Atlanta

University. Dr. Shackelford, the consummate educator, taught in Lynchburg, VA, Alexandria, VA and in DeKalb County, GA. She served as Assistant Principal at Stoneview Elementary and Principal of Flat Shoals and Canby Lane Elementary Schools. During her career, she received numerous honors and awards including Who's Who Among America's Teachers; DeKalb County Principal of the Year - Area III; and GAESP Distinguished Principal - District 7, State of Georgia just to name a few. In addition, she participated in the Superintendent's Professional Development Program - State of Georgia. She retired from the DeKalb County School System in 2007. She was currently working at Georgia State as Educational Supervisor where she continued to have a hand in educating prospective teachers. Whereas education was important to Ren e, the title of "Grandma" topped all of that. All 8 of her grandchildren, Cori, RaeKwan, Nya, Jada, George, Ynice, Sandy, and Bobbi were very special and precious to her. They ate several meals in her kitchen, had numerous "sleepovers" at her house and were the benefactors of many life lessons while under her tutelage. One would think that was a lot, but not for Ren e. She was an active member of Saint Philip African Methodist Episcopal Church where she served on the George Moore/Sarah Allen Usher Board. She was also the Debutante Masters Commissioner for Saint Philip AME Church of the 6th Episcopal District for over 20 years. Ren e loved God, her family, education and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. She pledged and was initiated into the glorious sisterhood in the Sigma Chapter of Clark College in 1969. She later became a member of Decatur Alumnae Chapter where she was a loyal, faithful, hard-working, committed, honest and devoted member. While a member of Decatur Alumnae Chapter, she served as 2nd Vice President, 1st Vice President, and served 2 terms as Chapter President. She was also the chair and committee member of several committees including the scholarship committee which she worked on continuously throughout her Decatur Alumnae Chapter career. She faithfully attended State Meetings, Regional Conferences, and National Conventions. Ren e's warm, giving, and caring personality along with her

leadership skills, creative talents and ??infectious smile? only gave you a glimpse into God??s deposit on earth. Dr. Rene Shackelford, the wife, mother, grandmother, educator, and Soror exemplified the text, ??Be Thou faithful until death? ?
