Richard Robinson, 81, of Loganville, Georgia, peacefully passed away on July 20, 2021, after a difficult battle with pulmonary fibrosis.

Richard was born on May 13, 1940, in Paterson, New Jersey and attended the legendary Eastside High School. Richard joined the United States Army at the age of 18, as a paratrooper in the 82nd Airborne Division. He was part of the First Airborne Battle Group (ABG), a brigade assigned to the 8th Infantry Division who was responsible for providing airborne capability in the event of a Soviet invasion. He was a decorated veteran.

After Richard's military service, he worked in the chemical industry until he retired. He also gave back to his community by serving as a Boy Scout Troop Leader for Passaic Valley, Troop 15. Richard was a force of nature who had an unbelievable strong work ethic. He was known to consistently arrive at work an hour before his start time.

When Richard wasn't working, he had a passion for bowling, cycling, and enjoying his first love, music. He was a music enthusiast. He played the trumpet and was a member of the Paterson Cadets Drum and Bugle Corps. He was an avid music collector who was well – known by many for his massive album collection. He is probably listening to Johnny Taylor's song, "Soul Heaven" and continuing his love of music in his new eternal home.

Richard was a loving husband, dedicated father, and committed grandfather. He joins his parents' Richard Robinson Sr. and Annie Mae Robinson in heaven. He is survived by his wife Rosemarie, his former wife, Carrie, his sister Barbara, and his children Vincent, Sharon, Judy and Karlene.
