With family surrounding him, Rick Darnell Taylor quietly transitioned from this world to be with God on Thursday, October 3, 2013. Rick was born February 3, 1967 in Harriman, Tennessee. At an early age he professed his belief in God and was baptized in 1978 and began his Christian development and education at St. Mary's Baptist Church in Harriman, Tennessee. There he served as a member of the junior choir and was an active student in Sunday school learning the ways of the Lord. Rick lived his life with quiet confidence in himself and his abilities, but most importantly in the power of God Almighty. He graduated from Harriman High School in 1985. He was an active student leader and outstanding athlete with the Harriman High School Football team. His exceptional athletic performance and strong academic skills earned him a scholarship to Middle Tennessee State University where he earned a Bachelor of Science with a double major in Actuarial Science and Finance in 1990. Rick had a deep passion for learning and teaching. He gladly tutored younger family members and friends on critical topics such as mathematical principles, times tables, the proper way to ride your first bicycle and how to swim a strong lap. In college

he worked with Sylvan Learning Center to assist students in obtaining their educational goals. In light of the challenge of his battle with sickle cell anemia, Rick maintained a strong commitment to physical well being and encouraged others around him to maintain their physical health as well. He shared his love of bodybuilding with friends and relatives and was quick to encourage them to stay as healthy as possible. Rick believed in and deeply loved his family. In 1992 Rick met the love of his life, Karen and they were married in 1994. This union and partnership was initiated through the extended loving hands of Karen's sister, Sharlene Brown and Rick's uncle, Larry Taylor. Upon first meeting her he exclaimed, "You're a sweet chocolate drop." Through their union, they were blessed with two children a loving son, Rick D. Taylor, Jr., and their precious daughter, Mariah. Traveling to his hometown to see his parents, reunite with his siblings and local community members was very important to Rick. He did this as often as possible. Rick had a great sense of humor and was famous for his sarcastic one liners expressed in a loving way. His dearest friends and associates all left his presence with a nickname that marked the love and humor exchanged in their relationships. Those nicknames and humor were always trademarks of an interaction with him. Rick expressed compassion for his fellow man. At the time of his diagnosis with sickle cell anemia, Rick was a college football player. The doctors estimated that he would not live past his mid-twenties. However, God favored him and gave him twenty more years. When he began to receive treatment at Nashville's Meharry Medical College for his illness, he was asked by the doctors to visit young hospitalized children who had sickle cell. The doctors asked Rick to visit the children as a role model demonstrating the importance of taking care of their physical body and the possibility that they could become stronger. The children were amazed by his muscles in light of their bodies which were generally very feeble. A man of many interests, Rick had numerous hobbies. He was a naturally inquisitive person with a fascination for animals – particularly those in the wild. The eagle was a special animal to him. Rick, along with his father and his brother engaged in competitive shooting.

He became a member of the International Defensive Pistol Association and the United States Practical Shooting Association. For Rick, Karen and Mariah, attending the latest movie releases was an important ritual on the weekend, and his plan for the upcoming year was to become "The Barbecue Pitmaster" for his family. Rick was a consummate professional, bringing his zeal for life to his work place. He served as the Budget and Fiscal Policy Director for the City of Atlanta's Budget Administration team from 1993-2006 and from 2008-2011. In 2006-2008 he served as the International Financial Advisor for the Municipal Finance Management Technical Advisory Program in Pretoria, South Africa. In 2012 Rick began a new venture at Cox Communications as a Senior Accounting Analyst. In this role, Rick performed analytical reviews of accounting transactions to ensure the accuracy of the Company's financial statements. Throughout his professional career he was known for his strong skill set as well as his compassion and support of his co-workers. Most importantly Rick was an active servant of God showing Christ to others through his deeds. Never complaining about his illness, he was daily anchored by God's mercy. His favorite song was "Great Is Thy Mercy Toward Me" which captured his appreciation for his ability to deal with his illness throughout the years. Rick was preceded in death by his son, Rick D. Taylor, Jr. and his brother, Solomon Kenya Taylor. He is survived by his wife, Karen and daughter, Mariah; his parents, Daniel W. and Patricia Taylor, Harriman, Tennessee; his sisters Dionne and (Marlon) Placide (Nashville, TN) and Jennifer Johnson (Atlanta, GA); his brothers Damyen and (Tabitha) Taylor (Nashville, TN); Derrick and Madge Anders (Rockwood, TN); his sister-in-laws, Selena Perry (Chattanooga, TN) and Sharlene Brown (Covington, GA). His nieces and nephews include Nia Placide (Nashville, Tennessee); Jalen Taylor (Nashville, TN); Ieashia Taylor (Chattanooga, TN); Solomon Taylor (Chattanooga, TN); Dontavis Taylor (Chattanooga, TN); Taylor Johnson (Rockwood, TN) and Chassidy Anders (Rockwood, TN). He also leaves behind his beloved nanny, Mrs. Minnie Love (Harriman, TN), and beloved aunt

Mrs. Brenda Hobbs (Stone Mountain, GA) and a host of loving aunts, uncles, cousins, family and friends.
