Roland Wade Perrin, Jr. was born on December 31, 1935 in Columbia, South Carolina and passed away peacefully at the age of 77 on Sunday, August 4, 2013. Roland grew up in Columbia, South Carolina and graduated from Booker T. Washington High School in 1953. After his high school graduation, Roland joined the Army and served honorably with tours of duty in Germany and Fort Jackson, South Carolina. Upon discharge from the Army, Roland enrolled at Clark College in Atlanta, Georgia where he pledged Omega Psi Phi and graduated in 1959. Roland married Evelyn Bannister in 1959 and was blessed with five children: Phyllis, Roland III, Jonathan, Stacy and Courtney. Roland began working as a teacher for the Atlanta Public School system in 1960. He taught in numerous schools in the City of Atlanta before leaving the school system to pursue additional opportunities as a manager at Terminal Transport. Roland returned to the Atlanta Public School System in the early 1980's where he served as a security specialist until he became ill in May of this year. Roland had a strong sense of right and wrong and was active in his community and particularly enjoyed mentoring young people in the Atlanta Public School System. Roland was an avid fisherman, loved baseball and as a young boy was able to attend Negro League baseball games. During his illness he enjoyed watching the Atlanta Braves and was extremely happy to witness the recent winning of his beloved Braves. Roland was preceded in death by his father Roland Wade Perrin, Sr., and his mother, Wilhemenia Sparrow Johnson. Roland is survived by his loving daughters
