I have such good memories of Ron. He was always hard working and industrious, but still found time to enjoy life. Together we gardened, fished, built a shed, and traveled. I recall lazy days on Lake Jackson, fishing in the coves and eating peanut butter and jelly sandwiches. We never caught anything but had such a good time. Once on a warm March day, Ron, Justin and I took the boat to a smaller lake up north that only allowed trawling motors. Suddenly a storm blew in with cold winds, and our boat was being blown away from the side of the lake with the boat ramp. The wind was overpowering the strength of the trawling motor. Justin and I rowed as Ron managed steering with the trawling motor. We finally made it to the ramp, but we had some worries getting there. We were so proud of our team effort to get out of that situation.

Road trips with Ron always included listening to the music of Mark Anthony and Yanni. I can never hear those songs without thinking of him. He had a beautiful singing voice, and loved to sing along to his favorites.

Ron enjoyed good food and had some serious cooking skills. He made an incredible fried turkey. I had never heard of tuna omelet before I met Ron (it's actually delicious).

After I moved away from Georgia, he visited me and brought me a

beautiful Japanese Maple tree that continues to thrive today in my yard. Everytime I look at it I think of Ron and his generosity, and the great friendship we shared.

Ron was so good to my family. When my aunt in Atlanta died, and we were all in Kentucky, he went out of his way to assist my father with a lot of the paperwork and issues that arose. As with all bureaucratic red tape, that was time consuming and frustrating. Ron took on the lion's share of the burden without complaint and gave my father such comfort during his grief. My parents never forgot his graciousness in their time of distress. They always felt great affection for Ron.
