Ronald Morgan, age 82, peacefully transitioned on April 16, 2026, leaving behind a legacy of love, strength, and unwavering devotion to family.

Born on June 12, 1943, in Chicago, Illinois, Ronald was the son of the late Arthur Morgan and Evelyn Morgan (Allen). He spent his early years in Chicago, where he built the foundation of the man he would become... and where he met and married his high school sweetheart, Zelda Morgan (McDougle).

Shortly after high school, Ronald proudly enlisted in the United States Air Force. His service took him and his beloved wife across the country and abroad, including time in Greenland, Texas, Massachusetts, and beyond. 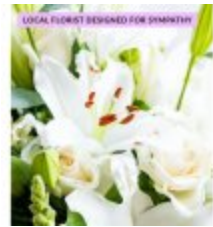

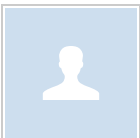
