



Ronnie Edward Moore

Ronnie Edward Moore died on July 12, 2022 in Decatur, GA after a brief but complex illness. He was 70 years old. A beloved husband, father, grandfather, brother, and friend, he passed away in the presence of his family—his greatest source of pride.

A calming and joyful presence who made a positive impression on all who encountered him, Ronnie loved nothing more than to lift others up. He was born on December 23, 1951, in LaGrange, GA, where he was raised by his grandparents and could be found at East Side Baptist Church almost every day of the week. He started traveling early, taking trips to visit his parents in New York City and ultimately moving to Atlanta to matriculate at Morehouse College. After he graduated with the 1973 class, Ronnie enlisted in the Marine Corps as one of only a few Black officers in his regiment. He served on active duty in the Vietnam War and achieved the rank of First Lieutenant.

After his honorable discharge, Ronnie earned his Juris Doctorate from Atlanta Law School, taking the first step toward what became an illustrious forty-year legal career with Allstate Insurance, retiring as a managing attorney for six offices in Alabama, Georgia and Tennessee. When competing firms tried to

poach his talent, he turned down higher pay in order to put down deeper roots in the city that he loved with his family. He married the love of his life, Betty in 1989 and they were a dream team -each the perfect complement to the other, as they built a life on the foundation of unwavering acceptance and support. He retired in 2017 to embrace the next stage of his life: spoiling his grandchildren with an endless supply of gummy bears, chips and toys and supporting charitable causes, especially those that were dedicated to the well-being of kids and their families. Ronnie believed that our purpose on Earth is to safeguard the happiness of others, and he lived each day in service of that mission. Sometimes he made us happy simply by refusing to be stressed despite the Type A women around him—like when he purchased a lily-white three-piece suit from Amazon.com and wore it to his sister's fiftieth wedding anniversary party, unable to check the fit in advance. Asked about his antics, he shrugged and spouted his standard wisdom: "It worked out."

We will miss Ronnie for his laughter, his smile (in both real-life form and his overused Memojis), and his perfect advice in any situation. To put it simply, he was an incredible human being and our North Star. He was preceded in death by his parents, James and Catherine Moore; his brother Anthony; and his grandparents, Ernest and Mattie Mae Bryant. He is survived by his wife of 33 years, Betty Moore; his daughters Nakicia Finley, Karmen Payne (Chris), Bianca Jones, and Breana Jones; his grandchildren Carlos, Xai, Skyla, Zahkaria, Kaleif, Liberté, Christopher, Jo'Siah and Zuri; sisters Evelyn Hearn (Vacher) and Dr. Jacqueline Moore (Robert Smith); sister-in-law Cathy Moore; aunt Carolyn Bryant and uncle Frank Bryant (Emma); as well as many other aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.

Visitation will take place at the Gregory B. Levett & Sons Gwinnett Chapel in Lawrenceville on Tuesday, July 19th 1pm-5pm. The family will not be in attendance; however, a memorial book will be available to sign. Funeral services will take place at the Gregory B. Levett & Sons Gwinnett Chapel in

Lawrenceville on Wednesday, July 20th at 11am. Burial services will take place at the Georgia National Cemetery in Canton, GA on Thursday, July 21st at 11am. Donations in Ronnie's honor can be made to The Atlanta Children's Shelter (<https://www.acsatl.org/>)

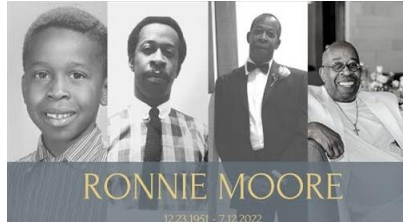

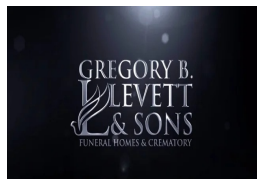
