Rosalind Celia Dossantos, age 61, died from recurrent endometrial cancer on December 20, 2021. She was born in South Rivers, St. Vincent to Alban Dossantos and Carlessy Nickie. She is survived by her two children Roland (44) and Rachael (41); and three grandchildren Camille, Chelsea, and Jahsias.

Everyone referred to Rosalind as Rose. She was a longtime educator nurturing children in their early development. Rose was very caring, giving, and free-spirited. She was active member of the Salvation Army Hialeah Corp (church) for over 30 years. The Army meant a lot to her and she served in many roles from employee, Sunday School teacher, and volunteer at local community food drives, red kettle campaign, and angel tree distributions.

Besides her children and grandchildren, Rose is survived by her brother Ali in London and several nieces, nephews, cousins and close friends including Claudette Briggs who helped Rose physically and emotionally close to the end of her life.
