Sally M. Wilburn Alexander began her earthly journey as a twin on February 4, 1941 to the parents of John, Sr. and Mozelle Cottle Wilburn in Smithville Georgia. She and her twin, Alyce were the fifth of 11 children borne to this union. She was called from labor to her eternal rest on December 12, 2017 at her home in Fairburn, Georgia.

Her family moved to West Palm Beach in 1945 to join the rest of the Motley/Cottle Family. She began her early education at Industrial/Palmview Elementary School and Secondary education at Roosevelt High School where she was a member of the Class of 1960.

She was reared in a devoted Christian family whose foundation supported a deep faith and abiding love for our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. They were Pillars of Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church, so at an early age Sally gave her life to Christ and was baptized by Reverend P. L. Harvey.
