“ Remember those end-of-the-year tests we had to take in school to prove that we're qualified to go to the next grade level? And we had to select our race; Black, White, Native American, or other. I asked my teacher Ms. White which one should I pick and she said black because that's how "they" will see you. She explained that it didn't matter if you are half black, you are 100% black in their eyes. Some would say that's too much to share with an eight-year-old. I did as she instructed, however, when I grew older I became defiant and always selected both white and black or other. I'm almost 40 years old and I fully understand that her intention wasn't to be technically correct or right but realistic. She didn't intend on making me choose sides between claiming my mom or dad. She didn't believe in labels either. She intended to prepare me for the real world, to alert and protect me for what's to come.

I've always shared that story with my partners, friends, and family but 1/12/22 was the first time I reflected on this and truly felt gratitude for her guidance, honesty, and protection. I love Ms. White so much. She remains here with me always. May her light continue to guide and inspire her family and all of those she loved 🙏 My deepest condolences to Kriss and the family. 🌸

Sheila taught us how to clean the greens and we would wash them until our fingers were raw to remove the extra protein. One of my last memories of Sheila was when we were in Williamsburg for Christmas. Sheila was cooking a huge pot of greens big enough to feed an army, extended family, and whoever else stopped by. She put a whole stick of butter in the greens- said it would make them tender, and they were some of the best greens I've ever had in my life. She had also taken up the task of making her mom's famous red velvet cake. It was the spitting image. To this day I won't eat anyone else's red velvet cake.

Sheila loved family, blended or extended, it did not matter, and Krissy was the joy of her life. Thank you Sheila for allowing us to be part of your family. We will always remember your dimpled smile that lit any room and brought joy to everyone who was part of your life.
