Suporia Michelle Jarman, (fondly known as Sissy), 54, of Ellenwood, Georgia was born in Jacksonville, North Carolina to the union of Hayes C. Jarman, Jr. and Shelia Devane.

Suporia relocated to West Palm Beach, Florida with her family where she spent most of her teenage life. She graduated from Twin Lakes High School and later moved to the Atlanta area where she worked for the State Board of Pardons and Parole until her recent retirement.
