He was the second of eight children to be born in Spalding Regional Hospital in Griffin, Georgia. His life was fruitful and filled with great love until disease knocked at the door on May 12, 2012. On that day, he suffered a massive Brain Stem Stroke. Although the Lord promises in Psalm 103 to heal all diseases, his love and grace called Terrell home to heaven. At age 50, Terrell departed his earthly shell after Emory University Hospital declared him brain dead on June 4, 2012. Terrell spent his very early childhood in Griffin, GA. After the dynamic of his family changed, he moved to Atlanta, Georgia with his mother and siblings. His new home and new life began in the East Lake Meadows community where he attended Charles R. Drew elementary school and later graduated from East Atlanta High School in the Class of 1981. He then attended Morris Brown College as

a music major blowing sweet music through a trombone. In the Meadows, at Drew, and East Atlanta, Terrell developed very strong friendships with men and women who laud him. The Lord touched Terrell's heart many years ago and led him to Simpson Road Baptist Church where he has been a leader in the church. He served as an officer of the church on the Trustee Board. For seven years, he was the captain of the Men's Day. Terrell had the pleasure of receiving the honor Father of the Year. This 2012 year, Terrell was selected as one of the keynote speakers to reflect on the life and teachings of the late Reverend Orange Weems. He had a trademark smile that was always on his face. Through a wide smile and smooth conversation, he wooed and married Mrs. Adrienne Jefferson Richardson. To that union, they were blessed with one daughter, Ms. Shequilla Q. Richardson now an adult. Later years after his divorce he had a son, Daevonne Richardson. Terrell was a very devoted single father and showed special care for his children. However, the true apple of his eye was his grandson, Marquavius Terrell Goodwin. Terrell took proud in everything that he did. He only had two major jobs -- security installation for corporations, and his positions with MARTA as a train and bus operator for 23 plus years. He had planned to retire from MARTA within 3 years to concentrate fulltime on the development of his baseball league for boys. Terrell loved children and discovered that sports were an excellent way to engage children in positive activities. Left to cherish his memory are his parents, George (Sandra) and Neomia Richardson; brothers, Howard Prater (Jeannette) of Macon, GA, Donnis Prater of Decatur, GA, Danny Richardson (Teresa), of Ellenwood, GA, and Daryl Banks of Griffin, GA; sisters, Carolyn Prater of Stone Mountain, GA, Marjorie Richardson-Tiller (Michael), Barbara Richardson, and Janice Richardson Moore, all of Decatur, GA; other siblings, aunts and uncles; a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives, and friends.
