Terry A. Collier was born in Swainsboro, GA on September 26, 1953 to both the late Christena Wright and John Collier. Terry was one of 11 children born to Ms. Christena Wright of Wrens, Ga. Terry developed a passion for running at a young age. After completing his primary years in education, he attended Cerritos College in Cerritos, CA where he studied business. While studying business, he took Advanced Running courses at UCLA. It was there in Los Angeles where he met Oriental Cherry Collier, and they instantly began building their family together.

Terry had a passion for running marathons. In March 2005, he was hired as the Executive Race Director in Los Angeles California where over 45,000

runners participated. He remained Executive Race Director through 2009. He was also a twenty-one year participant (runner) of this event and Legacy Runner. In December 2005, Terry Collier was employed to create Las Vegas' first ever marathon down the world-famous Las Vegas Strip. This race in its' inauguration, brought 20,000 runners down the Las Vegas Strip: a race that would be remembered throughout history.

Terry Collier was hired to mirror the marathon work he did in Los Angeles, California to be brought to the Las Vegas Strip. He exceeded all expectations and retained until December 2009. In addition to being an Executive Race Director and Legacy Runner of the Los Angeles Marathon, he was chosen to carry the Olympic Torch in 1996 for the Atlanta Summer Games. In the 1990's Terry Collier organized the Jimmy Stewart Relay marathon that raised over \$250,000.00 for St. Johns Child Study Center. In the early 80's, Terry partnered with Florence Griffin-Joyner "Flo-Jo" to organize a 5K-10K that raised funds for The Children's Hospital in Orange County, CA.

Besides running and organizing races, Terry worked for over 30 years in the grocery industry in Los Angeles and Atlanta to include Vons, Harris Teeter, Wayfield Foods and Sprouts. He retired from the grocery industry to focus on needs of the community business owners and residents to ensure they were thriving along the infamous MLK corridor. He was the President of The Martin Luther King Jr. Drive Merchant Association (MLKJDMA). In this position, he developed the "MLK 5K" in 2013 in partnership with UNCC. In 2018, the Inaugural "Race for the Dream" was founded by Terry Collier as Atlanta's first black marathon. In recent months as a way to help eliminate homelessness, Mr. Collier partnered with the Metro Atlanta Task Force for the Homeless in 2018 for "Stomp Out Homeless Challenge" bringing awareness.

Terry made many advances in community development. He partnered with Invest Atlanta to provide grant opportunities to established business owners

along the MLK Corridor which brought relief and sustainability to those businesses. He was best known also for the continuation of the late Councilman C T Martin's "Fish Fry at Hightower Manor for the senior residents annually for many years to provide food and good spirits. He was instrumental with the development of iVillage at the H E Holmes MARTA Station, a collaboration with Invest Atlanta and MARTA. During the holidays, Terry partnered with the DA's office to have a food and toy giveaway for the community. On June 23, 2018, he led the charge under the MLK Merchant Association partnering with New City U.S. to host a community awareness event with conversation on the state of affairs with the NAACP. Again, the MLK Merchant Association, he adopted a highway and was recognized by the Atlanta City Council for his efforts in promoting this initiative. He won countless awards and accolades throughout his career. He always had a very strong work ethic. He loved teaching the importance of integrity to his children and grandchildren. He was proud to have a family to build a legacy for and legacy was very important to him.

Terry passed away unexpectedly in his home while actively recovering from heart transplant surgery. He was 68 years old. He was a loving and devoted brother, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, uncle, friend and motivator. Terry Collier is survived by: former spouse, Oriental Cherry Collier their children- daughter, Terramani Collier Smith (Duane Smith) and son Ahmad Youngblood (Kia Youngblood); grandchildren- Khara Youngblood Verbov, Khalea Youngblood, Nalani Smith and Niles Smith; great-grandchildren- Viviana Verbov, Maksim Verbov, and Violeta Verbov; siblings- Henry Spence, Lillie Mae Spence, Frances Holmes, Bettie Wright, Danny Wright and Felton Wright and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, neighbors and friends who all loved and cherished their time with Terry. He will be deeply missed.
