I never acquired a taste for them. Some of my most precious recent memories of Aunt Thelma were our telephone conversations. We shared a faith in God and would talk about Him, the Bible and His Son (Jesus). I also learned more about her life as a teacher in GA, and her travels in the military with Uncle Jack. I will miss Aunt Thelma's infectious laughter, and having these conversations. But I can look forward to seeing Aunt Thelma again, in heaven.
