William Stuart Cox was born to Audrey Cox and Willie Harris on May 5, 1964, in Brooklyn, New York. He attended New York City public schools, including P.S. 138, I.S. 391, and Prospect Heights High School, later obtaining his General Educational Development (G.E.D.) certificate.

At the age of 20, Stuart welcomed his daughter, Shantel, his only child. He was very devoted to her, and they shared a special bond.

As an adult, Stuart moved to Clearwater, Florida, where his maternal aunt lived, marking the beginning of a new chapter in his life. He built a respected career with Florida Power, lasting over 20 years.
